












# Croc Rock Help Sheet

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1. Download and listen to the mp3 file.  
Visit our website: [www.musicfun.com.au](http://www.musicfun.com.au)  
Or ask us to email you the link.
2. Practice clapping and counting beats.  
Singing the songs helps students with the timing.
3. Divide the class into instrument groups.  
Students working in small groups helps them to listen to each other and practice their timing as well as getting used to their instruments.  
Let all your students share in playing.  
It's not that important how many musicians are used to play individual instruments.
4. Experiment with different instruments.  
Some instruments can be substituted and some can be used in conjunction with the ones recommended.  
Let your ear be your guide.
